### PHILIP TERRY BOOK REVIEW

Now that I am retired and no longer seeking advanced degrees I can read without fear of being tested. I now read simply for pleasure. Since I enjoy reading about Ireland this is a perfect place to pass on tips for some good "reads". Ireland has produced a legendary number of writers, playwrights and poets who in turn are responsible for a wealth of literature. All of this is available and part of the problem is picking something out to read. Here I can help. What do you like to read – fact, fiction, poetry or something else? I love a book I can't put down but I'll settle for one I remember where I put it so I can get back to it as soon as possible. There are over 40,000 new books out each year so it is hopeless to stay up with the latest. Instead, I like to choose an older book. Besides you can usually pick them up on <u>www.abebooks.com</u> <u>www.Amazon.com</u> or <u>www.readireland.com</u> usually inexpensively. Read Ireland is a good place to scan through Irish books in print. I find most of my books in used book stores. Since I am only going to recommend books about Ireland here are several that I enjoyed. <u>Blow-In A personal view of life in West Cork</u> by Nora Strong is a collection of columns written for The Southern Star, a weekly newspaper based in Skibbereen. Nora is an immigrant from England who relocates to improve her life and is fascinated by what she finds. Everything is new as she adopts and adapts to her new home. It is a delightful read and I could barely put it down. Although I picked my copy up for \$4 it is fairly expensive for a paperback on the sites mentioned above.

Another book is <u>Oh Come Ye Back to Ireland</u> by Niall Williams (a favorite author) and co-written by his wife Christine Breen. This is one of the books that caused me to go to Ireland. Niall has written a great many more books since this simple narrative. Originally from Dublin, Niall met Christine in the USA. After a few years in the rat race they decided to move to Ireland in live in Christine's grandfather's cottage near Kilmihil, county Clare. Two more books followed: <u>When Summer's in the Meadow</u>, and <u>The Pipes are Calling: Our Jaunts Through Ireland</u>.

On a personal note, I met Niall in his cottage twice over the years and I encouraged him to go on a book signing tour and mentioned Book Passage as an example. Two years later he was scheduled to be at Book Passage the same day I was catching a plane to Shannon. After a few quick emails to his agent I was able to meet up with him at Johnny Foley's in San Francisco the night before. His career as a writer has certainly taken off since then.

If you have not read <u>McCarthy's Bar</u> by Pete McCarthy, this and its sequel are a wonderful read.

If you want something a bit deeper you can try <u>Connemara</u> by Tim Robinson which is a pebble by pebble analysis of the whole Connemara area. It is similar to James Michener's treatment of his subjects. It is interesting if you are familiar to the area. Until the next newsletter – happy reading. *Philip*
